Implementing relevant interventions in California, Florida, Georgia, Indiana, Missouri, Nevada, New York, Ohio, Texas, and Virginia.</li> </ul> |
| Grant Program Goals | <ul> <li>Elevance Health Foundation is requesting proposals for programs and initiatives that support one or more of the following goals:</li> <li>Reducing disparities in pre-term birth rates</li> <li>Reducing disparities in severe maternal morbidity (SMM) incidence</li> <li>Improving maternal/infant health outcomes</li> </ul>   |
| Grant Range & Term  | <ul> <li>Grant Range: Open         The amount requested should be primarily limited to costs directly related to the implementation of the proposed program, and may include support for measurement, evaluation, and reporting.     </li> <li>Grant Term: 1–3 years based on need (12-month increments)</li> </ul>  |

| <ul> <li>Successful grant applications will be required to provide semi-annual reports demonstrating progress towards achieving metrics specific to the program goal. Such metrics may include:</li> <li>Improved pre-term birth rates among socially vulnerable populations</li> <li>Reduced SMM incidence (adverse outcomes) among socially vulnerable populations</li> </ul>   |
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| <ul> <li>Improved maternal/infant health outcomes such as those demonstrated<br/>through:</li> </ul>  |
| <ul> <li>Increased access to preconception, prenatal, and postnatal care and services</li> <li>Expansion of maternal health workforce</li> <li>Increase in care and services offered through non-traditional healthcare settings (i.e. mobile clinics)</li> <li>Increase in access to telehealth/digital tools and services</li> </ul>  |

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| Eligibility | Applicants must meet the following eligibility criteria:  |
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|             | <ul> <li>Proof of status as a registered 501(c)3 charitable organization under<br/>one of these Internal Revenue Code subsections:</li> </ul>   |
|             | <ul> <li>– 170(b)(1)(A)(vi). Receives substantial support from governmental units<br/>or the general public</li> </ul>  |
|             | – 509(a)(2). Normally receives no more than one-third of its support from<br>gross investment income and unrelated business income, and more<br>than one-third from contributions, fees, and gross receipts related to<br>exempt purposes |
|             | <ul> <li>– 509(a)(3). Operated solely for the benefit of and in conjunction with<br/>other exempt organizations (public charities):<br/>Type I, Type II, or Type III functionally integrated</li> </ul>                                   |
|             | <ul> <li>Clearly define measures and accountability standards, including<br/>key milestones</li> </ul>  |
|             | <ul> <li>Track and record long-term outcomes of program effectiveness and<br/>sustainable change</li> </ul>   |
